WHAT IS PBL?

Project-Based Learning (also referred to as PBL) is a student-centered pedagogical initiative that involves a stimulating classroom process allowing students to acquire a deeper knowledge through in-depth inquiry, and active exploration, of real-world challenges and issues.

SOME FACTS
